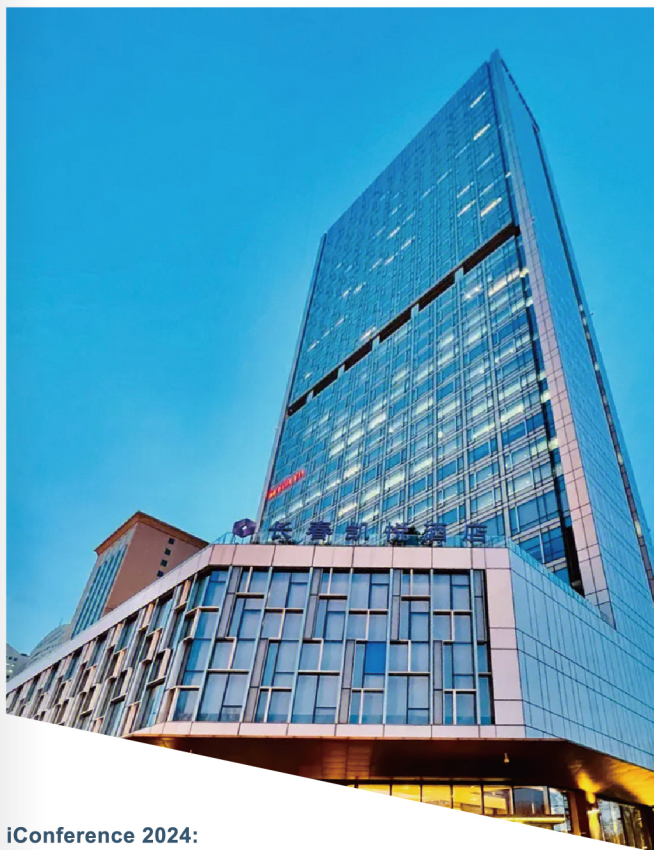

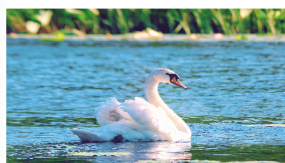

Jilin University is one of the key national universities in China and supported by the National "985 Project" and "211 Project". It has a multi-level educational system with complete disciplines and great academic influence. The campuses in Changchun cover an area of 6.11 million square meters, which includes a building area of 2.76 million square meters. There are 7.91 million books in the university libraries, which have been recognized by UNESCO, UNIDO, and the World Bank.

Jilin University engages in extensive global exchanges and in close cooperative projects with overseas universities. It has established cooperation and exchange relations with 303 universities, research institutions or international academic organizations in 40 countries and regions.

School of Business and Management of Jilin University was formed in December 2021 through the integration of the former School of Business, Jilin University, and the former School of Management, Jilin University. The former School of Management was founded in 1985, which is one of the first management schools approved by the Ministry of Education, China; the former School of Business was founded in 1993. The School of Business and Management has a multi-level school system with complete disciplines, outstanding research and teaching, and reasonable structure, which helps students enter the high-end job market and realize their career dreams with qualified and effective faculty and talent-cultivation capacity.



Changchun, as the capital of Jilin Province, is the second largest city in Northeast China. The name of Changchun literally means long spring and has the connotation of blessing and auspiciousness.

Changchun is the cradle of the People's Republic of China's movie industry as well as that of China's automobile industry. It is famous for being one of the first Chinese cities to access, dub and produce films. Changchun Movie Wonderland shows the film culture and history. In addition, Changchun is still one of the world's important automobile production and research bases. Changchun is also one of China's major production bases of high-speed trains.

Changchun is the birthplace of Ji cuisine. Ethnic groups such as Han, Korean, Manchu, and Mongolian have lived in Changchun since ancient times, creating a unique and diverse Ji cuisine culture. After several years of development, Ji cuisine blended the court dishes, Lu cuisine and Changchun folk dishes together to show its unique flavor to people and waits to be tasted. The famous cuisine includes but not limited by Wu La hot pot, hot canded sweet potatoes, fried pork in scpoon, snow coated bean paste and barbecue.
